1. Call to Order

SCCSDA Vice President Sue Fitzpatrick called the meeting to order at 12:03 p.m. and turned it over to SCCSDA President Stephanie Moreno upon her arrival at 12:17 p.m.

3. Presentation on Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund (ERAF) Distribution

Jacelyn Ma, Division Manager, County of Santa Clara Controller-Treasurer's Office, gave a presentation on ERAF and answered questions from the Board. Division Manager Jacelyn Ma reported ERAF was in enacted in the 1990s to resolve serious State budgetary shortfalls in 1992-93 and 1993-94 and permanently shifted over \$3 billion of annual local



property tax revenue from counties, cities, and special districts to ERAF, which represented approximately 17% of local property tax revenue statewide. She also reported excess ERAF is returned to respective jurisdictions after fulfilling all state obligation to non-basic aid school districts (e.g., State's obligation to non-basic aid school districts to the state guarantee level, pay for Countywide special education program).

4. <u>State Legislative Office Updates</u>

Anurag Pal, District Director for the Office of Assemblymember Alex Lee, reported on the Assemblymember's legislation in 2023-24 and invited the Board to reach out to provide feedback.

5. Business

a. Discussion and Approval of December 5, 2022 Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Director Bosworth, seconded by Vice President Fitzpatrick, and unanimously carried, that the Board approve the December 5, 2022 meeting minutes.

b. Discussion and Approval of Financial Report

It was moved by Director Estremera, seconded by Director Bosworth, and unanimously carried, that the Board approve the quarterly financial report ending on March 2, 2023.

c. Discussion and Possible Action on 2023 SCCSDA Officers

President Moreno reported she will be no longer be GCRCD's designee for SCCSDA. President Moreno nominated Vice President Fitzpatrick to serve as the SCCSDA President in 2023. It was moved by President Moreno, seconded by Director Bosworth, unanimously carried, that the Board appoint Vice President Fitzpatrick as the new SCCSDA President.

President Moreno asked the Board if anyone would like to serve as the 2023 Vice President. After a brief discussion, President Moreno nominated Director Helen Chapman to serve as Vice President. It was moved by President Moreno, seconded by Vice President Fitzpatrick, unanimously carried, that the Board appoint Director Chapman as the new SCCSDA Vice President.

It was moved by President Moreno, seconded by Director West, unanimously carried, that the Board appoint Director Estremera as Treasurer.

d. Discussion and Consideration of Resuming In-Person Meetings

President Moreno reported she and Vice President Fitzpatrick have discussed possibly resuming in-person meetings and having the in-person meetings held at various district offices so that the Board can learn more about each member district. The Board discussed hosting two in-person/hybrid meetings and two remote meetings per year. President Moreno asked Director Estremera if Valley Water could host the first in-person meeting in June, to which Director Estremera agreed.

6. Partner Agency Reports

a. Local Agency Formation Commission of Santa Clara County (LAFCO) Neelima Palacherla, Executive Officer, reported on LAFCO's Countywide Fire Service Review, which involves a comprehensive review of fire service and emergency medical



service (EMS) provision in Santa Clara County. LAFCO is targeting to release the draft report for public review and comment in May.

b. California Special Districts Association (CSDA)

Kyle Packman, CSDA Advocacy and Public Affairs Director, reported on AB 557, CSDA's 2023 sponsored bill on the Brown Act. This bill follows the successful passage of AB 361 (2021), which established modified remote meeting procedures within the Brown Act for local agencies meeting during specified emergencies. He reported AB 557 would eliminate the sunset on the emergency remote meeting procedures added to California Government Code section 54953, to allow local agencies to address future emergences and to effectively react and respond. AB 557 would also adjust the timeframe for the resolutions passed to renew an agency's temporary transition to emergency remote meetings to 45 days, up from the previous number of 30 days. He also reported on AB 2449, which provides public agencies with the additional ability for legislative body members to participate remotely in meetings without having to give the public access to private locations, provided the agency abides by the strict substantive and procedural requirements within the legislation.

7. Santa Clara County Special District Association Member Reports

Director Estremera reported Valley Water is the recipient of the 100th loan from the Water Infrastructure Finance and Innovation Act (WIFIA) and that the EPA will commit \$727 million in low-cost loans to Valley Water through WIFIA to help pay for critical water supply and flood control projects in Santa Clara County. President Moreno reported GCRCD has resumed inperson meetings and that Director Cindy McColl will be the SCCSDA representative from GCRCD. Director Logan reported the Los Altos Hills County Fire District is working on evacuation route preparation.
